February: The Month of Love

This month we celebrate 2 holidays, one that often gets overlooked, and another that, I would venture to say, evokes the biggest amount of mixed feelings of any other day in the year. And this year, they fall on the same day. The one that gets all the press has some people that absolutely love it, while there are others who dread it and others who absolutely despise it. I am talking, of course, about Valentine's Day—the 'day of love'. Those who are in a relationship may love it, as it is a day set apart for them to show their partner how much they care for them. It is a day they can celebrate the romantic side of love. But, even for those in relationships, there are some who dread it, because they feel the pressure of trying to make everything just perfect—by getting the right presents, and making sure everything is so romantic.

Then there are others who dread the day for other reasons. Many despise Valentine's Day because they are reminded everywhere they look that "love is in the air", just not for them. These are people, who for whatever reason, are alone and do not have a significant other to celebrate with, and everywhere they look they see reminders of that very fact. They may be able to do alright the rest of the time. Maybe they are used to being alone, but at Valentine's Day, they are reminded everywhere of just how lonely they really are. For these people, Valentine's Day can be pure torture and they just pray for the day to be over. I have to admit that I understand the range of emotions, because I have felt them all through the years. There have been many Valentine's Days that I have spent alone, but now I am blessed to have a chance to make the day special for my beautiful wife.

Valentine's has often been my least favorite holiday, and I can relate to those who don't look so favorably on it. But, even for those who face this day alone, we are reminded that we are not alone; we are never alone. God is always there, and it is His love that truly matters. We can face the loneliest days and anything else this life has to throw at us because of His love that surrounds us. In fact, the other day that we celebrate with Valentine's this year, the one that often gets overlooked, is one that reminds us of how great the love of God is. This year Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day. Ash Wednesday is a day that is often forgotten in the midst of all that is going on. It is a purely religious holiday. There is no way for the stores to make money off of it, so it doesn't get the push others do, but Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent, a time for us to prepare ourselves for Holy Week and Easter, when we remember just how great God's love for us is—that God in Jesus was willing to suffer so much and die as the sacrifice for our sins. Ash Wednesday reminds us that even though we are sinful, and so unworthy, God loved us enough to die in our place.

It is that great and awesome love of God that is the example for us in our earthly relationships. The unconditional love of our Gracious Lord is the model we need to follow always.

God loves us unconditionally, without regard to what we do and how many sins we have committed. God is our constant companion, loving us, calling us into relationship with Him and even when we mess up, He's there to pick us up, dust us off and put us back on the right path.

I Corinthians 13 tells us what true love is: "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends." (1 Cor 13:4-8a NRSV) This is a true reflection of the love God has for us, and in fact, we could replace 'love' in the passage with 'God' and it would be just as true, as God is Love. His love should be our model for all of our relationships, not just our romantic relationships. Love always looks to the good of others. If we truly love someone, we will put their needs before our own. That is what love is all about. It's not about some warm, fuzzy feelings that can came and go. It's about us making the choice to put someone else's needs before our own. Those with successful relationships have learned that things aren't perfect all the time. Those romantic feelings you had at the beginning, in the honeymoon phase, will ebb and flow. There will be times when you are madly in love with your partner, and there will be times when it seems that everything they do drives you crazy, but you still love them despite all of that. That is the kind of love that God has for us—it is always there and will never fail, even when we do.

A good exercise for us is to put our name into the passage, instead of 'love'. If I can't say "Dustin is patient; Dustin is kind, etc" then I need to do some praying for God to work in my heart to help me to love as He does. I pray this season of love will be a blessed one for you and yours. No matter how you are facing this season, remember that God is there and His love is better than any card or box of chocolates you could ever receive. Look to God to be your guide in showing all those you are in relationship with, how much you truly love them.
